GENETICS, ETHICS AND CLINICAL TRANSLATION

June 22 – 25, 2010

Summer Institute, The Netherlands

This four-day intensive course is designed for professionals actively involved in biobanking who want to learn more about the **ethical, legal and societal** implications of the translation of epidemiological results from genetic and genomic research to clinical practice.

The Summer Institute will offer insight about issues and solutions applicable to the field, and will give participants the opportunity to actively interact with the lecturers through debates and working group sessions. Some previous basic knowledge within ethics is recommended.

Three main topics will be covered:

- Introduction to translational research and ethical, legal and societal issues in biobanking
- The implications of genetic testing, personal genome and personalized medicine
- Ways to handle the interface with stakeholders and society

The faculty will gather world-known experts whose work reflects broad international experience.

A registration fee will apply. The fee will cover accommodation, catering and tutoring for the whole duration of the Summer Institute. Participants may apply for a travel bursary to help defray the registration and travel costs.
